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Dates & Daily Schedule

August 6, 2018 to August 10, 2018.

- OSU professors teach 45-minute lectures and facilitate workshops throughout the day
- Lunch break and activities such as campus, lab and library tours
- Group discussion and collaboration on an original research project with Team Leaders in the afternoon
- Return home at 3PM



All applicants must complete an application by April 9th, 2018 consisting of:

- A personal statement: What you might bring to the Summer Institute and what you might hope to learn from the Summer Institute
- School transcript Unofficial transcripts are acceptable
- Teacher recommendation: this can be mailed, or e-mailed by your teacher—a teacher or mentor who is qualified to comment on your performance and ability in courses that best reflect your readiness to engage in the Summer Institute content.

Tuition

Tuition is \$575 and includes instruction, course materials, meals, and supervised campus activities. Financial aid is available in the form of partial and full scholarships. Aid is granted based upon need, as well as other factors including merit.
